Through personal projects, collaborative workshops, and cultural immersion, the program encourages creative confidence and a fresh perspective. By blending artistic mentorship with exploration of French traditions and community, participants leave with renewed purpose and a deeper understanding of themselves and the world.

MORNINGS

Collective Explorations: Discovering Inspiration Through Art and Connection

Collective Exploration sessions are designed to inspire connection, creativity, and artistic growth by diving into France's rich artistic heritage. Through collaborative workshops, participants explore pivotal movements like Impressionism and French filmmaking, uncovering techniques and stories from masters like Monet, Cartier-Bresson, and Méliès. These sessions foster meaningful bonds with fellow creatives, encouraging the exchange of ideas and the discovery of new creative directions. By engaging deeply with history, culture, and community, participants refine their voice and broaden their artistic perspective.

Samples of Collective Explorations include:

The Decisive Moment: Capturing Life in Motion

Explore the art of seizing the perfect moment through the lens of Henri Cartier-Bresson, the master of the "decisive moment." Learn to create dynamic, spontaneous compositions that reflect the essence of your surroundings. Through guided photography walks, build a collective gallery that celebrates the beauty and movement of daily life.

Impressionism: Painting Light and Life

Dive into the history of Impressionism and its foundations by studying the works of Monet, Sisley, and Renoir. Paint in the very landscapes that inspired these masters, from Monet's gardens in Giverny to the shores of Étretat. Discover how capturing light and atmosphere can transform your approach to painting and drawing.

Visual Diaries: Creating Your Carnet du Voyage

Combine art forms to craft your personal *Carnet du Voyage*, a travel journal blending painting, drawing, photography, writing, and collage. Inspired by the French tradition of documenting travels, create a rich visual narrative of your journey through Normandy, capturing its culture and scenery in your unique voice.

En Plein Air: Painting Outdoors in Normandy

Immerse yourself in the Impressionist tradition of *en plein air* painting, inspired by Normandy's captivating light and landscapes. Study Monet's process and techniques, and

experiment with capturing the essence of changing skies, water, and countryside in your own outdoor work sessions.

Women of Impressionism: Perspectives and Legacies

Explore the contributions of women artists like Berthe Morisot and Blanche Hoschedé-Monet, Monet's granddaughter, to the Impressionist movement. Examine their unique perspectives and creative approaches while reflecting on the role of women in shaping art history.

Storytelling in Art: Finding Your Narrative

Uncover the power of storytelling in visual arts through workshops that challenge you to identify the stories you want to tell. Using inspiration from artists like Dorothea Lange and Gordon Parks, learn how to craft compelling narratives through photography, painting, and film.

Filmmaking in France: Past, Present, and Future

Trace the origins of filmmaking in France, from Georges Méliès' groundbreaking works to the innovation of the French New Wave with directors like Godard and Truffaut. Participate in experimental filmmaking workshops, drawing inspiration from these iconic movements to create your own short films.

Visual Storytelling: Photography and Film

Discover the art of visual storytelling by studying the works of Sebastiao Salgado, Agnes Varda, and other masters. Experiment with photography and filmmaking techniques to craft stories that blend imagery and emotion, capturing both the everyday and the extraordinary.

Writers of Paris: Finding Inspiration in Words

Draw inspiration from the literary giants of Paris, such as Ernest Hemingway and Gertrude Stein. Study their work and explore how they captured the vibrancy of French life. Through writing exercises, reflect on your own journey and create pieces that merge observation and imagination.

Dive into mentored studio practice, where you can develop a portfolio or experiment across mediums like writing, photography, painting, or filmmaking. Whether honing a single discipline or blending techniques, this time encourages you to express your personal creative style and explore what feels meaningful to you.

Guided by resident artists and mentors, *Personal Pathways* is an opportunity to play, refine your voice, and push creative boundaries. The experience culminates in a capstone project, where you'll share your journey in a form that resonates with you, such as a gallery, anthology, or film. This is your time for self-discovery, artistic growth, and celebrating your unique perspective.

LATE AFTERNOONS

Culture Club (Optional)

Immerse yourself in the essence of France, exploring its language, history, cuisine, and artistic spirit. In this weekly club, discover the luminous landscapes of Impressionists like Monet, the daring energy of modern artists like Basquiat and Hockney, and the profound impact of the Norman Conquest on French and English history. Learn French basics and uncover stories of France's past while enjoying hands-on cooking classes that celebrate traditional Norman flavors. Together, we explore the rich creativity, traditions, and resilience that shape France's unique identity.
